Herb Hilder was installed as the moderator for the 2024-2025 church year. Below are a few highlights of our meeting!

The Business Team Report:

- Rev. Jon Van Den Berg has retired effective July 31, 2024.
- The Presbytery of London has agreed to support the grant application of St. James Presbyterian Church, North Yarmouth to the Supporting Ministries Grant – Sustaining Ministries program
- The Synod of Sothwestern Ontario will be holding their annual meeting over Zoom again this year and we will be needing to send commissioners
- The vacant position of Moderator-Elect needs to be filled in short order with the one-year term as moderator beginning **September 2025**
- The annual review of the positions for clerk and treasurer was presented and all recommendations were approved

Ordination and Induction:

The congregation of Knox-St. Andrews Presbyterian Church presented a call to Sonia Brule to become their new minster of word and sacraments. Several members of the congregation spoke to the call. Sonia graciously accepted the call. The ordination service for Ms. Brule will be held on **Sunday September 29**th at 7:00 pm at Oakridge Presbyterian Church. Details for the subsequent service of induction at Knox-St. Andrew's will be forthcoming.

Minutes of Recognition:

Rev. Keith McKee presented a memorial minute for **Rev. Deane Cassidy**. Deane was a minister at several churches in the Presbyterian Church including St. Andrew's in Strathroy and was listed on the appendix of the Presbytery of London.

Rev. Andrew Fullerton presented a minute of appreciation for **Rev. James Patterson** for his two years of service as General Presbyter. Jim was instrumental in the initial implementation of this new role for the Presbytery. Several other Presbyteries have been seeking to learn from our experiences.

Team Reports:

Both the Ministry Team and Congregation Teams reported diligence as they gather again after a well-deserved summer break.
